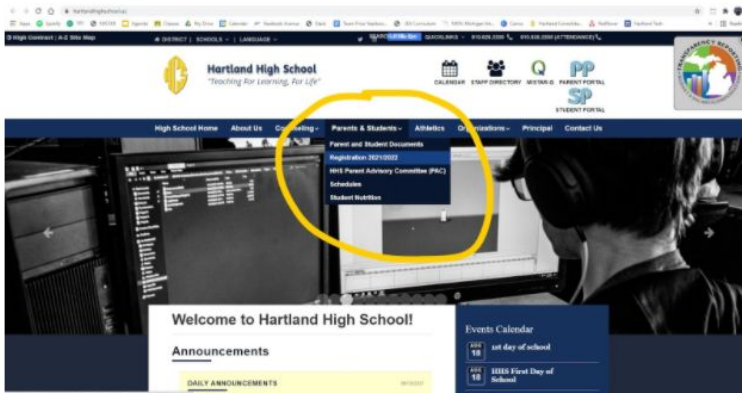

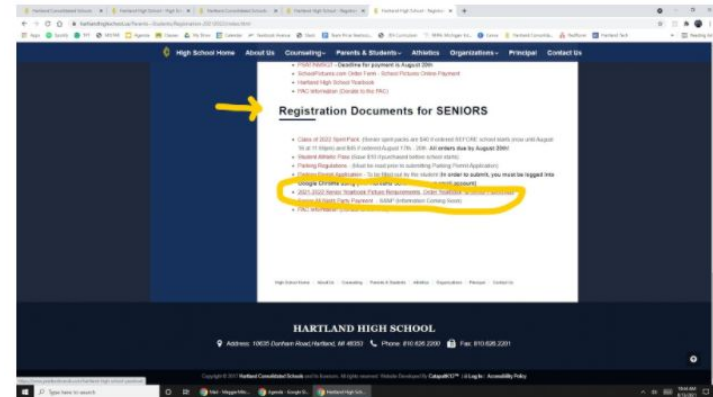

Yearbook Online Ordering

1. First, go to the [Hartland High School](https://www.hartlandhighschool.com) website and click on the "Parents & Students" tab. Then, click on "Registration 2021-2022".



2. Next, scroll down to the bottom where it says "Registration Documents for SENIORS". Click on the link that says "2021-2022 Senior Yearbook Picture Requirements, Order Yearbook, & Senior Parent Ads".



3. From here, you can do three things:
 - a. Order a yearbook
 - b. Purchase a Senior Recognition Ad
 - c. Upload a Senior Portrait



Graduation Requirements

- A student must successfully complete...
 - 25 credits, which include:
 - 4 years of English
 - 4 years of Math
 - 3 years of Science
 - 3 years of Social Studies
 - 2 years of World Language
 - ½ credit of Health
 - ½ credit of Physical Conditioning
 - 1 credit of Visual, Performing Arts

 - MME Testing

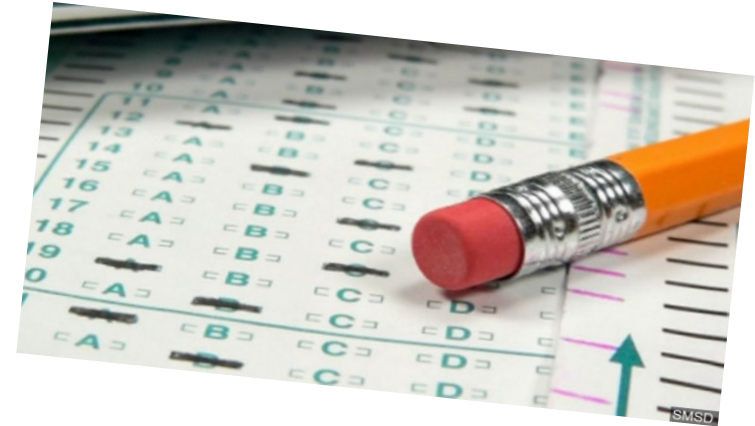
Where does your student stand?

- Minimum 18 credits earned by beginning of 12th grade to be on track to graduate
 - $18 + 7 = 25$ (3.5 credits 1st sem & 3.5 credits 2nd sem)
- Credit status letters will be mailed home by the end of September
- Students must have successfully completed 25 credits – including all required classes – in order to participate in the graduation ceremony

College Applications

- Apply online by going directly to the college/university website
- Common Application
 - 800+ Colleges including many in Michigan
- Coalition Application
 - Use the school's application or the Common Application
 - Only accepted by MSU & University of Michigan
- Michigan College Month
 - College Application Week: October 4th - 8th, 2021

Sending Transcripts

- Parchment: Hartland's Transcript Provider
 - www.parchment.com
 - Class of 2022
 - Last grade completed is 11th grade
 - FREE during senior year!
- Colleges Using the Common Application
 - Your counselor uploads the transcript to the Common App

Letters of Recommendation

- Some colleges & scholarships will require them
- Ask someone who knows you well (teacher, coach, boss, etc.)
- If possible, ask a teacher in the subject you plan to study
- Give the recommender at least 2 weeks notice
 - **October 15th** for November 1st application deadlines
 - **December 3rd** for January 1st application deadlines
- Provide a resume outlining your accomplishments and extracurricular involvement
 - Requesting recommendations from Counseling

- **FAFSA**

- Available beginning on October 1, 2021
 - Use 2020 tax returns
 - Available online at [StudentAid.gov](https://studentaid.gov)
- Some schools require a FAFSA on file to be considered for internal scholarships/aid
